The Pemberton Township Fire Department Rules and Regulations promulgated on January 1, 2013 are hereby amended solely by inserting a new section identified as Chapter 3:4, and entitled "Probationary Period" as page 25 (a) immediately after page 25, as follows:

3:4 Probationary Period

3:4.1- All Firefighters, Junior Firefighters, EMT and Fire Police Officers shall serve a six (6) month probationary period. Any probationary member found to be in violation of any of the Departments Rules and Regulations, Standard Operating Procedures or General Orders may be terminated.

3:4.2- During the six (6) month probation period the member shall be required to maintain 50% of duty, unless sufficient reason is given, and authorized by the Fire Chief. All probationary members shall be evaluated by the Battalion Chief or the Station Commander with a report submitted to the Chief's Office in accordance with the Department's Standard Operating Procedures, Section 25 Annex J.

3:4.3- The Battalion Chief or the Station Commander shall submit to the Chiefs Office a written request to approve, extend , reclassify or release the probationary member from membership along with any and all, documentation in support of their recommendation. The probationary period may only be extended once with the authorization of the Fire Chief for good cause.
