PerformCare serves as the first stop for families into Child Behavioral Health Services and tracks care for children and their families. PerformaCare offers toll-free information and referral services which are available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. They assist families in finding and accessing services.

PerformCare is the Contracted System Administrator for Child Behavioral Health Services. PerformCare assists The Department of Children and Families of the State of New Jersey with managing the service system, provides administrative and technical support, and quality management to help improve services.

Children's Mobile Response Service System

Children's Mobile Response Service System provides mobile response service to children in Burlington County who are experiencing an emotional or behavioral situation that threatens to disrupt their living arrangement. Trained response intervention workers are available 7 days a week to deal with crises at the child's location for up to 72 hours. They can offer up to eight weeks of follow-up service to stabilize the situation based on the needs of the child and caregiver.

Partners for Kids and Families, Inc. is a non-profit organization that provides service planning and care management for children with complex emotional and behavioral needs. Care Managers work in partnership with children and their families on Child/Family Teams. The teams are selected by the family and may include friends, therapists, teachers, and family members all working together to coordinate in-home services and community based support. The team creates an "Individualized Service Plan" to keep children with their families, in school, with community supports.

Youth Case Management

Youth Case Management, a program of Family Service, provides individualized services for children with emotional/behavioral needs. YCM is a moderate level of face-to-face service coordination. The Youth Case Manager will work with the child and family to locate or to continue with local resources to assist in having a child remain at home within the community.

Family Support Organization

The Family Support Organization of Burlington County is an agency whose staff and volunteers are all parents or primary caregivers of children with behavioral, emotional or mental health needs. Their trained advocates work with families who are involved with the Care Management Organization, Partners for Kids and Families, Inc. Families from the community are welcome to attend trainings, speakers and support groups. Our warm line and Special Education Warm Line are open to anyone from the community. This group of families helps to make sure that the "Family Voice" is being heard by advocating on committees that make a difference in our children's lives.



Youth Partnership 609-265-8838

Youth advocacy organization formed and run by youth with emotional, behavioral or mental health needs. Membership is on a voluntary basis and youth must be between ages of 13-21.
